Four things you may not know about GLAUCOMA:

1. Glaucoma can be hereditary.

If you have a family member who has been diagnosed as having glaucoma, you are at greater risk of developing it and should have a comprehensive annual dilated eye exam.

This is particularly important if you have other

risk factors, such as age (60+), diabetes, high blood pressure, your ethnic heritage, severe nearsightedness, or a history of eye injury. Our eye surgeons use advanced state-of-the-art computerized evaluation techniques to detect early signs of damage caused by glaucoma and the vision loss associated with it.

- **2. Glaucoma is "silent."** The most common type of glaucoma ("open-angle") often goes unnoticed in its early stages because it usually does not cause pain or immediate changes in vision, which is why it has been dubbed "the silent thief." If you have glaucoma, the first warning sign or symptom may be the gradual loss of some of your vision.
- 3. Once glaucoma steals vision, it does NOT give it back. Glaucoma causes permanent vision loss, but treatment can slow or stop it and reduce risk of blindness. The earlier glaucoma is detected, the better chance you will have of retaining as much of your vision as possible.
- 4. You may not know if YOU have glaucoma. More than three million
 Americans have it, but only half are actually aware that glaucoma is slowly stealing away their vision. Having a comprehensive dilated eye exam may be your only chance to find out before you experience permanent vision loss.


